

County Hospital found out
they received a 5-star rating
from the Centers for Medicare
& Medicaid Services (CMS).
CMS updated its Overall Hospital
Quality Star Ratings for 2023, awarding
483 U.S. hospitals with a rating of five
stars.

The hospitals that received five-stars in Iowa were:

- Boone County Hospital
- VA Central Iowa Healthcare System (Des Moines)
- St. Luke's Hospital (Cedar Rapids)
- Iowa City VA Medical Center

- MercyOne Dubuque Medical Center
- Finley Hospital (Dubuque)
- Lakes Regional Healthcare (Spirit Lake)
- Waverly Health Center

CMS assigns star ratings to U.S. hospitals annually based on 46 hospital quality measures. These are divided into five quality categories: safety of care, mortality, patient experience, readmission rates and timely and effective care. Data reporting periods range from July 2018 to March 2022, depending on the measure.

"This award demonstrates the high quality of care we provide at Boone County Hospital. It shows how much we care about our patients and their outcomes. Safe Sleep Certification



ational Safe Sleep Hospital
Certification Program in
Boone, Iowa, was recently
upgraded from the bronze
level, achieved in 2021, to a
silver level certified hospital for their
commitment to best practices and
education on infant safe sleep by
the National Safe Sleep Hospital
Certification Program. Boone County
Hospital (BCH) is one of nine hospitals
in the state of Iowa that is Safe Sleep
Certified (as of September 2023); of
those nine, BCH is the only critical
access facility that is certified.

The National Safe Sleep Hospital Certification Program was created in 2015 by Cribs for Kids®, a national infant safe sleep organization. Head-quartered in Pittsburgh, PA, Cribs for Kids is dedicated to preventing infant sleep-related deaths due to SUID (Sudden Unexpected Infant Death) and accidental suffocation. As a Nationally Certified Safe Sleep Hospital, BCH continues the commitment to follow safe sleep guidelines recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and provide training programs

for healthcare team members and family caregivers.

"Sleep-Related Death (SRD) results in the loss of more than 3,500 infants every year in the U.S.," said Michael H. Goodstein, M.D., neonatologist and medical director of research at Cribs for Kids*. "We know that modeling safe infant sleep in the hospital and providing education to families has a significant effect on infant mortality. Cribs for Kids Hospital Certification Program is designed to recognize those hospitals that are taking an active role in reducing these preventable deaths."

ast year, Boone County Hospital (BCH) generated 796 jobs that added \$47,147,025 to Boone County's economy, according to the latest study by the Iowa Hospital Association.

"We are excited and proud to share our local impact with you," says Mikaela Kienitz, BCH CEO. "Boone County Hospital is a vital part of the economic landscape in our community. We work hard to bring new services and programs to Boone County, so those services are available locally. We are also working to build new and strengthen existing community partnerships so we can continue to be a strong community

advocate and partner."

The study was compiled from hospital-submitted data to the American Hospital Association's annual survey of hospitals. The study found that Iowa hospitals employed 145,252 people in 2022. As an income source, hospitals provided over \$9.3 billion in wages. Hospital expenses accounted for over \$21.5 billion of the state's gross domestic product.

"We are proud of the positive economic impact our Hospital has on our community," says Troy Thompson, BCH Board of Trustees Chair. "This is a nice ancillary benefit that is made possible due to our focus on our primary mission, which is 'Improving and enhancing the health and well-being of those we serve.'"

"Iowa's hospitals and health systems implemented the programs and services accounted for in this study in response to their communities' needs," IHA President and CEO Chris Mitchell said. "Many of these programs and services wouldn't exist without hospital support and leadership. These efforts, with IHA's advocacy, help ensure the financial stability of hospitals, making it possible for them to provide the services and programs most-needed by the people they serve."
